Baptists on Mission exists to glorify God by involving churches and Christians in meeting human needs in Jesus' name.

As you explore our project's designed magazine, we hope you recognize your role in serving others in Jesus' name. We believe every Christian is called, gifted, and sent. In John 20:21, Jesus says, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." We are all called to live with a sense of purpose and mission! Living sent can take many forms, whether it's helping to clear a home after a flood, taking blood pressure readings at a health screening, packing Appalachian Christmas backpacks, assisting in the construction of the Village of Hope in South Africa, or countless other acts of service. These are opportunities to share Christ with others.



Where Do I Fit In?

Baptists on Mission Ministries

AGRICULTURAL MISSIONS

The purpose of BOM Agricultural Missions is to glorify God by involving Christians in meeting poverty and hunger needs through Agricultural Missions. Volunteers are needed from all walks of life, including foresters, crop scientists, soil scientists, beekeepers, teachers, homemakers, engineers, and farmers.

AVIATION MISSIONS

The Aviation Ministry involves pilots in ministry by providing medical air transport for patients en route to medical care, long-distance air transport for families in need, ground transportation for patients, and assistance in disaster situations. **Earth Angels** are responsible for meeting the inbound Angel Flight and driving passengers to the treating facility, hotel, and/or doctor's office.

BAPTIST BUILDERS

Baptist Builders involves volunteers in all types of construction projects in and out of state. This ministry includes:

Handyman Ministries which involves assisting those in need by offering volunteer labor upon request for building wheelchair ramps, minor home repairs and other needs for the physically disabled, **Disaster Rebuild**, and **Missions Construction**.

BAPTIST EDUCATORS

AA ministry for educators who have a heart for missions and wish to use their educational skills to adopt a local school in various ways, teach **English as a Second Language** (ESL) to reach internationals for Christ and pray for students and teachers for the school year.

CHILDREN MISSIONS

Children Missions opportunities are available to assist families and churches in engaging elementary-age children in mission education and hands-on mission experiences. **Deep Impact Kids (DI Kids)**, is a pre-packaged week or weekend hands-on mission experiences. As a result, elementary-age children and their leaders are provided the opportunity to be the hands and feet of Christ.

CHURCH RENEWAL

The Church Renewal Journey is a "pew-to-pew" ministry designed to assist the congregation in experiencing a spiritual awakening. Led by lay volunteers, these weekends are known to both revitalize and encourage churches to change their worlds in Jesus' name.

COLLEGE MISSIONS

College Missions is for reaching, discipling, and sending the 18 to 25-year-old population of North Carolina found on our college and

university campuses. In addition, this ministry offers a missions initiative to involve college students in state, national, and international mission projects.

COMPASSION MINISTRIES

All churches are called to share God's love and grace with those who are hurting. Compassion ministry encourages, resources and equips NC churches in the following areas: supporting families affected by disability, foster care/adoption, helping those experiencing divorce or separation, tutoring, hunger relief, helping free people from addiction, job training, and many other areas.

DISASTER RECOVERY MINISTRY

Disaster Recovery is a great way to minister to people affected by disasters. We help with clean-up (tear-out/chainsaw), temporary repairs (tarping roofs, etc.), and other recovery needs. In addition, disaster training events teach volunteers various skills needed to perform their duties under stressful situations.

DISASTER RELIEF MINISTRY

The purpose of Baptists on Mission Disaster Relief Ministry is to relieve human suffering caused by disasters. The goal of BOM Disaster Relief Ministry is to provide ways for Christians to minister to people who are hurting. In addition, we seek to provide organization, equipment and strategy for committed volunteers to help affected individuals/families rebuild their lives and homes.

FAMILY FOUNDATIONS MINISTRY

Family Foundations seeks to assist and encourage churches, pastors, and church leaders in all aspects of the family: Marriage Retreats, Family Enrichment, and Family Missions Involvement.

INTERNATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS/PROJECTS

There are numerous international opportunities that are available for involvement in Armenia, Cuba, Guatemala, Kenya, Moldova, Hungary, Roma Gypsy, South Africa, and Ukraine. We want to glorify God by involving churches and Christians in international short term missions.

MEDICAL MOBILE HEALTH SCREENING AND MOBILE DENTAL MINISTRIES

There are many opportunities for medical and dental personnel to be involved in missions with BOM including International medical mission trips, the Mobile Dental Ministry and the Mobile Health Screening Ministry. In addition, support persons skilled in medical assistance and **non-medical** laypeople are involved in this ministry.

MEN'S MINISTRY

Purpose: assist churches in providing a well-rounded, balanced ministry that challenges men to grow in their walk with Christ; share their faith with others; find their place of service in the local church, and be on mission with God. Outdoor Ministry is another part of Men's Ministry.

NATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS/PROJECTS

Many national missions opportunities are available for your church in places like the Appalachian Coalfields, Pennsylvania, New England, Rocky Mountain, Hawaii and Alaska. There are a big variety of mission projects that are needed.

NC STATE PROJECTS

Mission Camps at Red Springs, Rose Hill and Shelby: involve churches and Christians in life-changing mission projects at an affordable cost; each mission camp can house and feed up to 200 volunteers at a time.

COMMUNITY MOBILIZATION

Does your community know that your church cares about them? **Impact NC:** connects churches and individuals with week-long volunteer mission projects in children's ministry, evangelism, music, and/or construction, plus more. Basic construction skills training is also provided for volunteers.

PRAYER SUPPORT

Because prayer should undergird all we do as Christians, churches are discovering new ways to become involved in missions through prayer walks, as well as praying for mission needs, mission volunteers, and missionaries.

STUDENT MOBILIZATION MISSIONS

Deep Impact Missions Weeks are pre-packaged mission experiences that allow middle and high school students and their leaders to share the love of God with people throughout North Carolina and around the world.

Disaster Response Training is an important step in participating in any disaster we have been asked to respond to. In 2025 we trained over 3,000 people. Let's do that again this year. Training prepares you to know what to expect and how to prepare to respond. Training helps you get to know your leaders. And training gets you on the first call out for disasters we respond to. Of course, the best training is at a response site in the midst of helping people who are hurting. Spring 2026 training registration will open September 1:

CONSTRUCTION SKILLS TRAINING



Hanging and finishing drywall, laying laminate flooring, framing a wall, or building a wheelchair ramp may seem like foreign languages, but they can be the avenue for you to make Christ known and seen in your community. You can be “Jesus with skin on” to your neighbors or around the world.

People in every community need help. The needs in your community may be for building wheelchair ramps, installing grab bars, doing small home repairs or assisting with other construction needs. Is your church prepared to answer the call? Hands-on training for those with limited construction experience can help us move out of our seats and into the streets to be the hands and feet of Jesus.

Construction skills training can open the door for you to serve at the Baptists on Mission Red Springs, Shelby, or Charity Mission Camps; volunteer at our disaster rebuild centers in Eastern NC or in WNC; or go on a construction mission trip. There are projects in the Appalachian Coal Fields, New England, the Rocky Mountains, and throughout NC where you can use your new skills. You will also learn more about our rebuild opportunities at six rebuild centers we are operating in Western NC after Hurricane Helene.

Imagine helping hurricane survivors return home, assisting a church plant or replant renovate a facility, or changing lives in your own community! Plan now to bring a group from your church to learn new skills, develop stronger relationships, and prepare to move out to serve and reach your community.

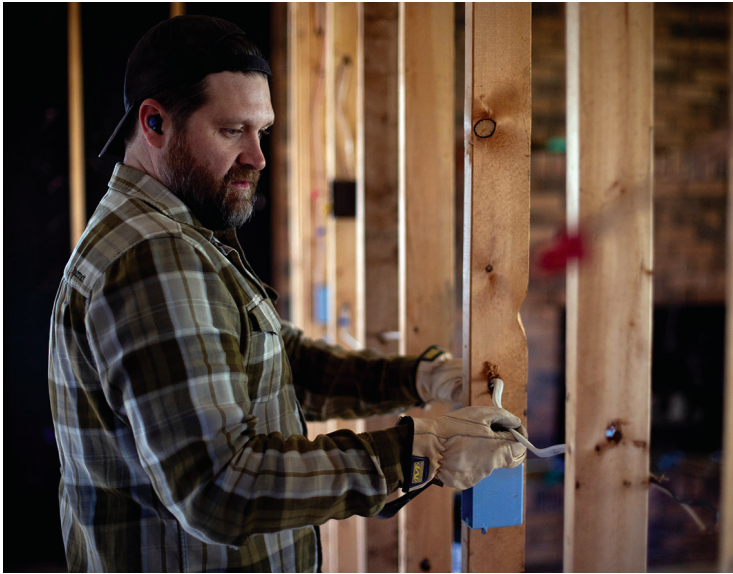
DISASTER REBUILD: REBUILDING LIVES, OFFERING HOPE



Rebuilding lives is a marathon and not a sprint. Thousands of volunteers answered the call since late 2024 after Hurricane Helene devastated WNC. Teams have been rebuilding homes and lives in eastern NC since Hurricane Florence hit in 2018. By serving in the Baptists on Mission Rebuild Ministry you can help families step back into a home after it was shattered by disaster.

Disaster Rebuild is one way that we can help put the pieces back together. Volunteers at Baptists on Mission rebuild sites in Canton, Rose Hill, Lumberton, and New Bern have answered the call to offer hope for the future to over 2000 families in Haywood County and Eastern NC. Since January 2021 more than 50 families have received the keys to a brand new home thanks to the service of thousands of volunteers and funding from several state government grants and private donors.

On September 27, 2024 Hurricane Helene cut a deadly and destructive path through WNC. Now Baptists on Mission are operating rebuild sites in WNC to show God's love by helping families rebuild and repair their homes and lives. You can help bring hope for tomorrow.



The need for volunteers at our rebuild sites is great! Whether you are a skilled construction pro or a novice, you can be a blessing to families on the long journey back after floods have destroyed their home. We can use volunteers of all skill levels but those who can do plumbing, electrical, and HVAC installations are particularly critical.

It also means that your church's gifts to the North Carolina Missions Offering (NCMO), which provides the entire regular budget for Baptists on Mission, are as important as ever. We could not operate our rebuild sites without your gifts to the NC Missions Offering and designated gifts to Baptists on Mission. 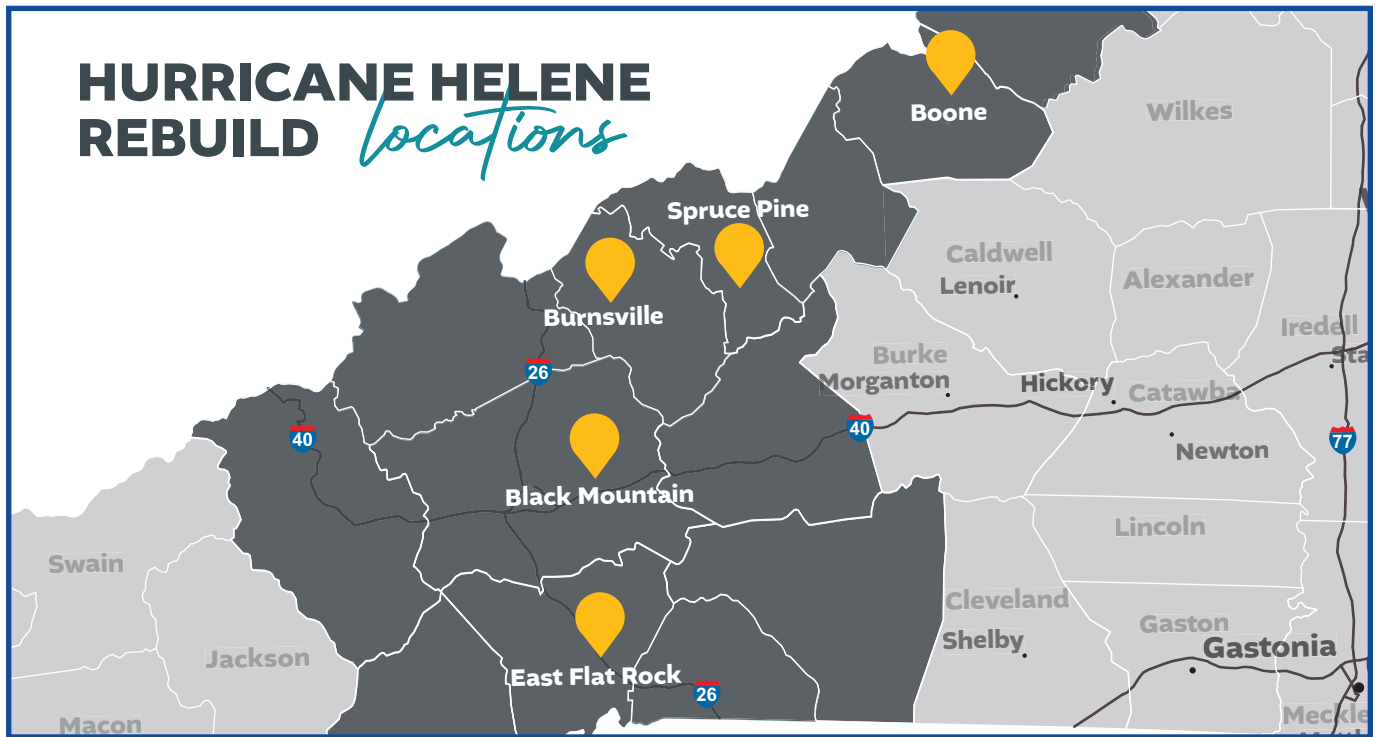

ROSE HILL (CHARITY) MISSION CAMP



PURPOSE

The purpose of Charity Mission Center is to assist churches, individuals, and organizations to get involved in missions by using their God-given gifts and talents to impact the work of the Kingdom through Word and Deed. We accomplish this by offering affordable short-term missions opportunities to men, women, students, and families.

FACILITIES

Our facility can house 200 volunteers in our 62,000 SQ FT facility. We have 16 private shower stalls, with handicap availability and a self-serve laundry room. On our site, we have a game room, a lounge, a gym, and sports fields. We have an exercise room for physical health and a prayer chapel for spiritual health. We also have a tool room that is equipped with all the tools and supplies needed. We have classrooms and conference rooms that teams can use to have Bible studies and team building time. There is an on-site thrift store and food pantry.

HOW CAN I GET INVOLVED?

Construction, Handyman ministry, Wheelchair ramp construction, youth camps, Men retreats, Women retreats, Couple Retreats, Prayer Retreats, Packing and distributing senior adult food boxes, working in the thrift store or food pantry, Sports camps, VBS, Backyard Bible clubs. We are also willing to work with your team on creating your own mission experience that fits your church.

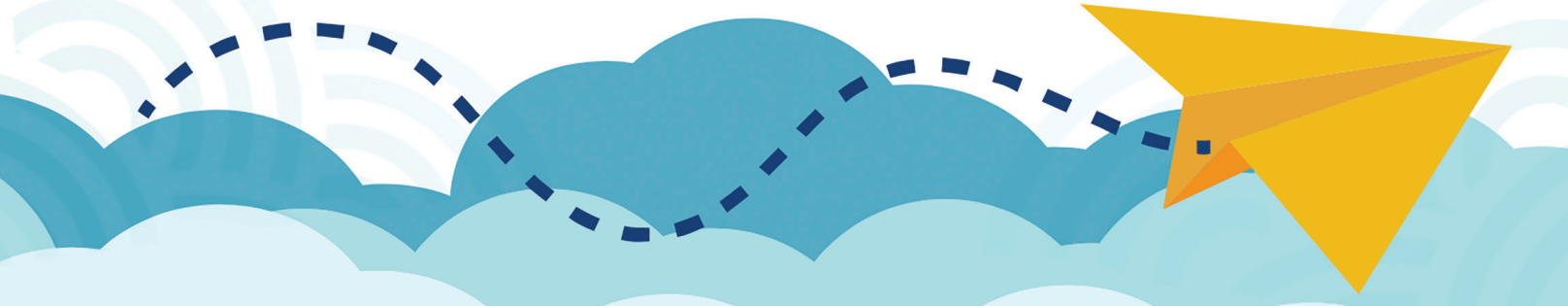

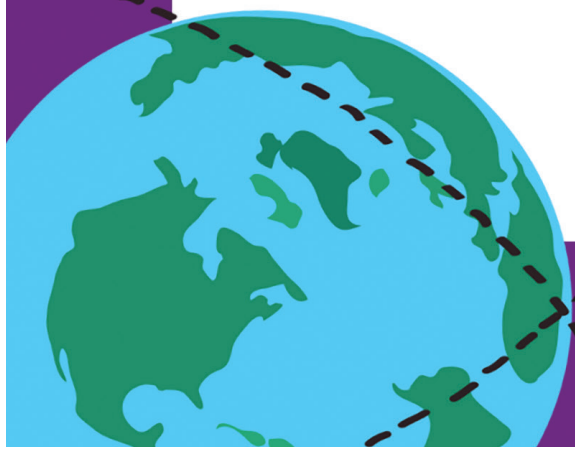

APPALACHIAN CHRISTMAS OUTREACH



Making an eternal difference in the lives of children at Christmastime.

One of the greatest ministry needs in Appalachia occurs at Christmastime. Each year Baptists on Mission calls on churches statewide to respond to this need through Appalachian Christmas Outreach. The goal is to fill backpacks with specific items to be distributed to Appalachian children and their families in early December each year. The state-wide collection day is the first Saturday in November each year. Thirty-plus collection sites are set up across the state to receive backpacks from 9am until noon.

We encourage churches to begin collecting items and filling the backpacks early – and throughout the year.

ITEMS TO COLLECT *Each zippered backpack should include:*

- 1) **ITEMS OF NEW WARM CLOTHING** including a winter cap, gloves, 2-3 socks, and scarf
- 2) **METAL POP-TOP CANS OF FOOD** (3-4 cans) such as ravioli, tuna, beef stew, vegetables, fruit
- 3) At least one or two **NEW, AGE-APPROPRIATE TOYS**
Examples: small cars, balls, dolls, small stuffed animals, puzzles, jump rope, sidewalk chalk, Slinky, card games, Legos, other (no toy weapons, please!) For the older youth category, substitute appropriate items for toys. No pocketknives! (See website for suggestions).
- 4) **HYGIENE ITEMS** including toothbrush, soap, washcloth, brush / comb, full-sized shampoo toothpaste, deodorant (please fit these items into a one-gallon Ziploc bag so they will not leak).
- 5) **FRESH, WRAPPED CANDY** (no chocolate please, as it may melt – and no peanut products due to allergies)

- 6) **A CHILDREN’S BIBLE – Or – A CHILDREN’S BIBLE STORY BOOK – Or A YOUTH BIBLE** (no particular version is required) ***This is the most important item that goes into the pack! Please include!***
- 7) **A COPY OF THE CHRISTMAS STORY** (downloadable and printable pdf found on the ACO website)

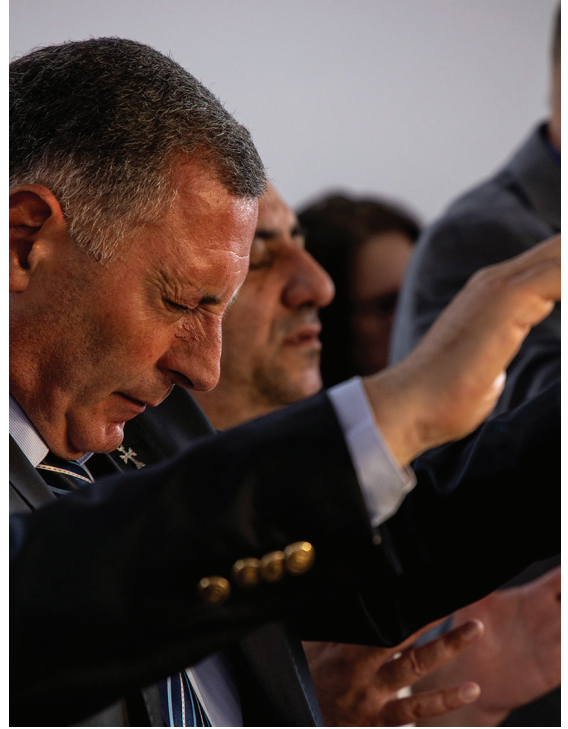

ARMENIA: THE LAND OF NOAH



Baptists on Mission has had the privilege of walking alongside the Armenian Baptist Union for more than 20 years. The opportunity is greater now than ever. After years of devastating war with neighboring Azerbaijan, a wave of revival is sweeping the country. More than 100,000 refugees from the Nagorno Karabakh Region have flooded Armenia. Other refugees are finding safety from wars in the region. Churches are filled, hundreds of children participate in VBS, and many new believers are committing their lives to Christ.

In May 2025 a new Yezidi Kurdish Christian church was dedicated in southern Armenia. The community of believers had been meeting in the pastor's home for years while they prayed to have a church building. With only five (5) Yezidi Christian churches in the world having a building was a huge dream. Thanks to many volunteers and sacrificial donors the dream of a new church building became a reality. At another church, a porch was closed in to make a kitchen for refugees from the war with Azerbaijan so that they can live in the church building long term. Refugees are also coming from other countries to find safety in Armenia. Doors are wide open for the gospel!

Teams can lead Pastors' or Women's Conferences, conduct sports camps or VBS, help with construction of a new church, assist pastors and church planters, or work with refugees. In 2026 we are planning to build another church building in central Armenia in a town with no church. You can fan the flames of revival by volunteering or donating to the Armenia Partnership.

CUBA



Baptists on Mission has partnered with the Eastern Baptist Convention of Cuba since the early 2000s, beginning with the construction of a retirement home in Santiago. Currently, work is ongoing at the camp in Santa Clara, located in central Cuba. This camp will serve as a training center for pastors and church leaders in one of the least evangelized areas of the island. In addition, the camp will host youth and children’s camps, as well as serve as a retreat center for church groups.

To meet critical needs, water purification units have been sent to areas without access to clean water. Cuban churches are using these units as a tool to share the message of the “Living Water” with their communities.

In 2026, we plan to send teams to both Santa Clara and Santiago for construction projects. The current political climate only allows us to send construction teams. Teams going to Santa Clara will primarily focus on construction, involving block work and cement. Teams traveling to Santiago will assist with either construction or maintenance at the retirement home.

To Be Involved in 2026

3. Cost per individual is approximately \$1,500 per person. This includes lodging, meals and transportation in the country, airline ticket, insurance, travel visa, tshirt. Team size can range between 5-10 persons per team. The exact cost per person will be determined once airline tickets have been secured.

GUATEMALA WORK & WITNESS TEAMS



Baptists on Mission (BOM), working in cooperation with IICD (International Indigenous Community Development) have sent teams to Guatemala since 2011. Most teams are housed, and prepare meals, at the beautiful Good Shepherd Ministry Center in Quetzaltenango. Baptists on Mission will register, arrange for local logistics, and secure airline tickets for all teams. Exact price varies, depending on cost of airfare, but averages around \$1750 per person.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR SERVICE IN 2026:

CONSTRUCTION TEAMS

Multiple teams are needed to assist in the continuation of construction on a director's house located on the site of the Good Shepherd Center. Teams will have supervision and work with Guatemalans on-site. A variety of construction skills are needed, and there is a job for everyone. If needed, teams may also assist with various "home improvement" projects in and around the Good Shepherd Children's Home facility.

MEDICAL / DENTAL TEAMS

Two to three teams are needed to serve in mobile clinics in strategic villages. Teams should be built around 2-3 primary care providers (MDs, DOs, NPs, or PAs) who will see patients. Other team members serve as support personnel, and should be mostly medical professionals. Teams will need to bring in the medications they will use, counting on seeing at least 30 patients per doctor; per day.

SCHOOL OUTREACH TEAMS

Three to four teams are needed to conduct 2-3 days of school outreach, similar to Vacation Bible School, with Bible Story, games, crafts, recreation, and music. Students will either be brought in to the

Good Shepherd Center for daily activities – or the team may travel to areas just outside of Xela. The team will need to provide all materials. On other days, the team will work on projects at the Good Shepherd Center.

CHILDREN'S HOME STAFF RELIEF TEAM

One team of 10-12 is needed to run the Good Shepherd Children's Home for four days and nights while the regular Children's Home staff are attending a retreat. This will entail care for 20-25 children, who range in age from infant to early teens. The team must have a Spanish translator and a registered nurse.

CHILDREN'S HOME ASSISTANTS

Couples are needed to serve as assistants at the Good Shepherd Children's Home. Length of service will be from one to three months. Volunteers will assist the Children's Home staff in whatever tasks are needed. This may include cleaning, maintenance, painting, cooking, washing clothes, landscaping, or any other number of tasks. It is suggested that those seeking this assignment participate in a week-long mission trip with Good Shepherd before committing to this longer commitment.

KENYA WORK & WITNESS TEAMS



For A True Taste of Africa – Come to Kenya!

Houses of Hope:

As part of a church planting strategy, houses are being built for families in need. Each mission team of 5-16 volunteers will build four houses in four days. A small team of Kenyan builders will work alongside the team. This particular kind of construction can be done by any team regardless of skill level. The recipients of the houses, usually widows or families in need, are determined by the village, working in conjunction with area pastors. Often, these families are unable to keep their houses up to safe, sanitary standards. The house-building project brings the community together for service to one of its members and exposes them to the Gospel through a house dedication service. Local pastors are active in planning, conducting, and follow-up of the project. After the team departs, the pastors come back to the village and conduct an 8 week Bible study in the new homes. The hope is that out of these home Bible studies, a new church will begin. Several new churches have been started this way.

In addition, teams will have the opportunity to visit door to door throughout the village, with a translator. The team shares why they are there, give their testimony, and present the plan of salvation. Children gather at each site, curious as to what is going on. Teams can plan to gather the children to tell Bible stories, sing songs, and play games. One of the local pastors will translate.

Dates: Trip dates can be worked out at almost any time throughout the year. Team leader simply needs to contact BOM with an 11 day timeframe in mind – beginning on a Tuesday, and culminating the following Friday.

Team Size: Ideal team size is five to eight members, but larger groups can be accommodated, up to 16.

Logistics: BOM will arrange airfare, lodging, in-country transportation, and other logistics for each team.

Costs: Exact cost of the trip will depend on current airfare, but will be approx. **\$2600-2800 per person**. This will include airfare, food, lodging, in-country transportation, orientation, and insurance.

Other: Trip cost also includes a one day and night visit to the Masai Mara National Game Reserve, one of the premier animal viewing experiences in all of Africa.

MOLDOVA PARTNERSHIP



Moldovan Baptists have invited North Carolina Baptists to partner with them in the coming years. Recent events have served as a reminder of how fleeting the opportunity to serve in this area may be. The time to strategically assist our Moldovan brothers and sisters in Christ in strengthening an evangelical presence - is now.

A CHURCH PLANTING EMPHASIS: The primary focus of the Partnership will be that of supporting a church planting missionary through growing, visionary Moldovan “mother churches”. These “mother churches” are led by strong, visionary pastors. They are gospel-focused and mission-hearted. Currently there are over 750 villages in Moldova with no evangelical presence. The great desire of these churches is to see that every village in their region has an evangelical church.

STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS: North Carolina churches will pair with a Moldovan “mother church” to support targeted and strategic church planting efforts by supporting a church planter for a period of five years. They will be asked to commit to providing \$430 per month during that time. Moldovan Baptists will contribute an additional \$100 per month for a total of \$530 in support. More details can be found on our Moldova Partnership webpage. In some cases, 2-3 NC congregations pair together to support the church plant.

PARTNERSHIP ROLES: The Moldovan “mother church”, with the guidance and encouragement of the Moldovan Baptist Union, will develop the planting strategy, identify a qualified church planter or planting couple, sent that planter out as part of their church ministry, and provide regular supervision and mentoring. The North Carolina partner church will provide ongoing prayer support, encouragement through regular and creative communication, and monthly funding for the church planting effort. In addition, partners may develop mutually agreed-upon projects – such as Vacation Bible School, outreach ministry, sports camps, etc., that mission teams can participate in. Teams traveling to Moldova will register with the Baptists on Mission office who will coordinate logistics including travel, insurance, and background checks.

ROMA PARTNERSHIP



Join us in Hungary, Romania or Ukraine as we build strategic partnerships with Hungarian-speaking Roma and Hungarian churches, and public schools run by our Baptist partner, Hungarian Baptist Aid. These unique opportunities are a great place for your church team to connect and build long-term relationships internationally. Teams of various sizes are needed for all the opportunities listed below.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR SERVICE

Hungary: English Bible Camps - A church can send a team of 6-12 people to host a 5-day camp in public schools filled with children of all ages, preschool to teens. During these camps, the team can openly share the gospel through the provided curriculum, relationship building and personal testimonies. Your church can adopt the school and build a long-term partnership.

Intern in Hungary – Summer and semester opportunities exist for college students to work in the schools or help our missionary in the summer with team coordination and logistics.

Teach in Hungary – Are you looking for a great way to spend a gap year internationally? Over 40 Baptist public schools in Hungary would love to have a native English teacher serving in their school. This opportunity is open to college graduates, retirees or those who want to serve internationally for a minimum of one year. More information is available at www.baptistsonmission.org/teachinhungary.

Medical and Dental Clinics – Medical and Dental personnel are needed to serve the Roma through providing medical

and dental clinics. Meeting physical needs paves the way for gospel conversations.

Outreach Ministry Teams – Teams can serve alongside churches in Hungary, Romania and Ukraine to help them reach their communities by providing children's ministry, youth ministry, adult ministry, worship services and home visits.

SOUTH AFRICA – DOOR OF HOPE VILLAGE



Offering Hope to the Hopeless

Imagine working to turn what used to be a farm into a village that will be home to as many as 200 children who began life abandoned. Making the concrete blocks from piles of sand and gravel may not be on your “bucket list” but building a safe, loving home for a child who is desperate for a forever family gives new significance to even the smallest task. Helping children know that they are loved is the backdrop for serving at Door of Hope Village.

Not only does the Door of Hope save infants from abandonment, but they show the love of God and give children a place to grow up rooted in faith, hope, and love. Building homes is just the beginning. Hundreds of children who are not chosen for adoption will make their home at Door of Hope Village. The alternative for most would be spending their entire childhood in a state-run orphanage only to be sent out at eighteen years of age with no one to help them make their way in life. Door of Hope Village will offer those not chosen for adoption a place to grow to adulthood. That will mean building a school, a child development center, and dozens of homes in the years to come.

UKRAINE PARTNERSHIP



Baptists on Mission continue to monitor the situation in Ukraine and we are prepared to help Ukrainian Baptists rebuild their country upon the end of the war. While we wait for more opportunities to open up, we are sending teams into Western Ukraine, where we can serve in various ways.

Summer Camp Teams: Teams of 8-10 people can serve the refugee children during the summer by providing a day camp in the shelters.

Evangelism or Trauma Healing Teams: Counselors trained in trauma healing may have the opportunity to train leaders in Ukraine on how to minister to the thousands of families impacted by the war. As the teams share guidance on how to help others, it opens the door for gospel conversations between local leaders and hurting families.

Medical Teams: Small teams made up of medical professionals may serve alongside a Ukrainian doctor to assist the internally displaced living in shelters. Specifically needed are doctors, nurses, pharmacists, nurse practitioners and physician assistants.

These teams will fly to Budapest, Hungary and travel by van across the border into Ukraine. The approximate cost is \$2200-\$2700 (based on airfare). A ministry fee of \$1000 - 2500 may be needed per team based on project needs. Volunteers serving in Ukraine must be 18 or older. Trips are typically ten-day trips with one day for touring Budapest.

LEAST OF THESE

“Whatever you did for one of the least of these, you did for me.” Matthew 25:40



Partner with nationals that we know and trust to offer hope in the midst of hopelessness with a one-time donation or a recurring gift to *Least of These Projects*.

ARMENIA – Help church planters (\$200 or more per month), build a church building in a town with no church, or support refugees from war with Azerbaijan who are living in church buildings.

UKRAINE – Provide a nutritious meal for Roma children through the Love Help Teach soup kitchen that feeds 150 children per day and has expanded to also offer meals to senior adults affected by the war.

SOUTH AFRICA – Help build a “Baby House” that will offer a home to infants abandoned beside the road, dumped in garbage cans, or thrown in rivers. Build cottages that will give toddlers not chosen for adoption a place to call home.

CUBA – Help build a new seminary in Santa Clara or provide a water purification unit (\$1200) that will offer water to an entire community.

HAITI – Sponsor an elementary school student for \$30 per month, provide meals to students battling to overcome gang violence for \$1 per person per day, or help install a water system that will provide drinking water for a village of 30,000 people in southern Haiti.

HUNGARY – In Roma Gypsy camps, a church building often serves as the only gathering place. Help some of the most rejected communities in the world experience the love of Christ.

AFRICA – Sponsor a church planter through Africa for Christ for \$200 per month, decreasing each year over five years. These church planters are serving in countries across Africa.

Gang violence has forced Dr. Vlad, who worked with Baptists on Mission after the earthquake in 2010 and established the ALOM Clinic in Cabaret, to flee to southern Haiti. His new ministry is meeting the needs of an entire village by teaching life skills, leading sports camps, and planting a new church. Collecting water from the roof for showers and flushing toilets has been helpful, but when it does not rain they are forced to pay \$200 for one load of water. One immediate need is for a water line that will supply water for the town of 30,000 people at a cost of about \$15,000. A local hospital is willing to support the project offering solar panels, an inverter, maintenance, and to distribute the water every other day to the area homes.

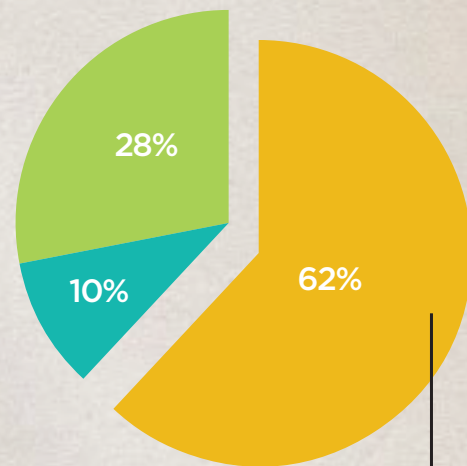
